An introduction to people with dementia

Dementia is one of our national priority areas, along with care and support at home and children who are looked after.

We know that things need to be done to improve social care for people living with dementia, including making sure people can find the care and support they need in rural communities, and using Welsh where it is people's first language.

One in a Million: Dementia Training Resource

A two and a half hour classroom-based training package to help those who work with people with dementia.

The session will give your staff a better understanding of dementia and its different forms and helps you achieve the aims of the Good Work Dementia learning and development framework.

Staff will also learn practical tips about improving the day-to-day experiences of people with dementia. The package includes guidance notes and video to support the facilitator.

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These resources are for anyone supporting
a person or people living with dementia in

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their own home, for example domiciliary care
workers or health care assistants, allied

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health professionals such as occupational
therapists, physios, dieticians, social workers

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or nursing staff.

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The Dementia Reablement Training Resources
bring together a range of different resources,

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which are practical, strengths based and flexible.

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These include: a video which offers guiding principles to support people living with dementia,

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another video which introduces Positive Approach to Care as a way of delivering a relationship

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centred, enabling approach, a workbook that gives information about dementia reablement,

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information about dementia friendly design and meaningful activities, and a number of

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practice dilemmas to support the understanding of behavioural and emotional expression of

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They might guide and support clinical supervision.

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To give people a range of options, the same content is available in different formats.

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So, somebody who is responsible for staff training or supervision, such as an allied

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health professional or team manager, may work through the resources in one format to improve

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their own knowledge and understanding, or use the same resource in another way to support
