## Overview

There are approximately 30,000 carers under the age of 25 in Wales. A carer is someone who provides or intends to provide care for an adult or disabled child. According to the 2011 census, Wales has the highest proportion of carers under 18 in the UK.

The Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Act 2014 brings with it substantial changes to the rights and entitlements of young and young adult carers. These resources, developed by Carers Trust Wales, outline how the Act relates to these carers and what this means for identifying, assessing, and supporting them.
