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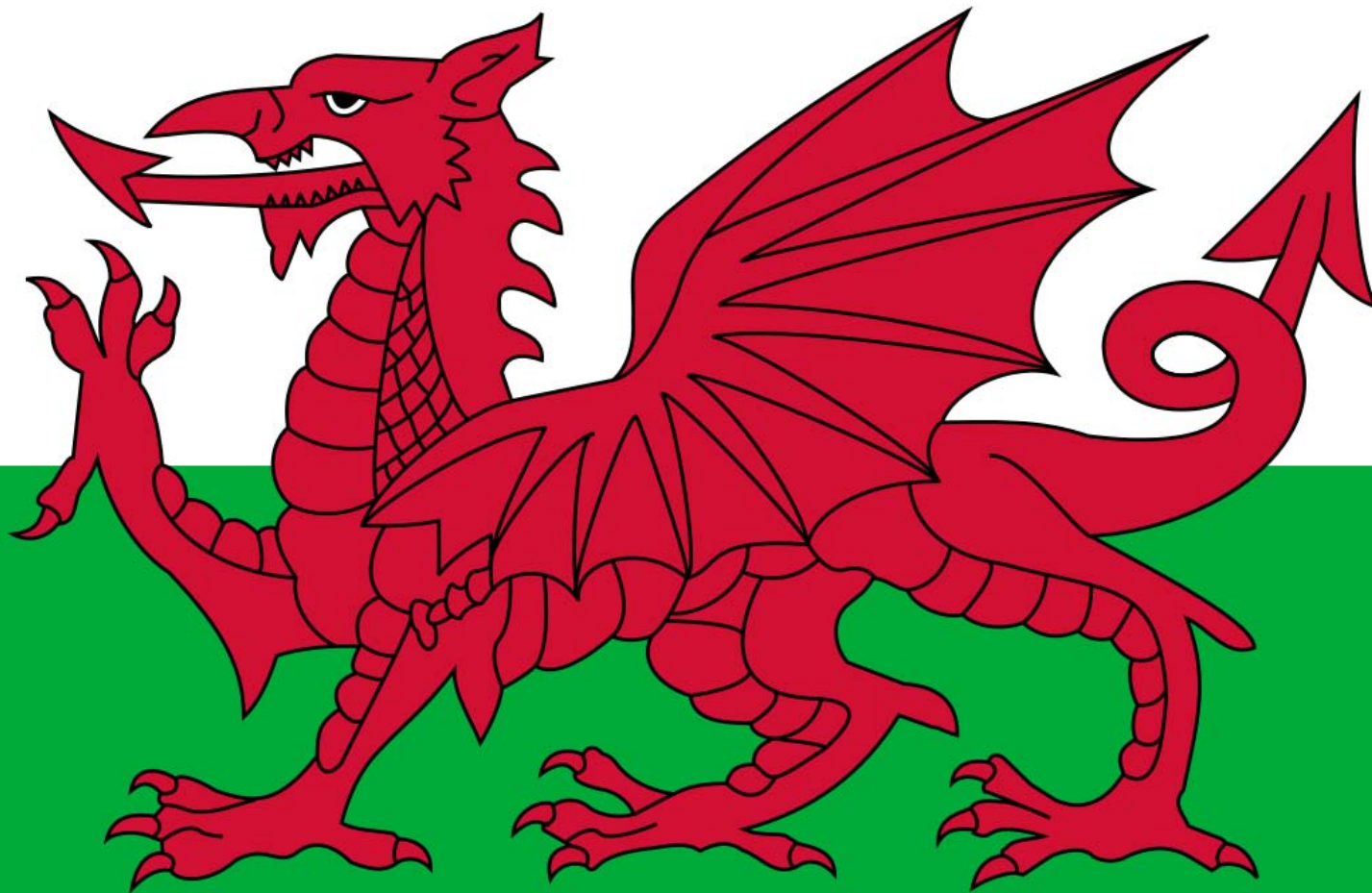

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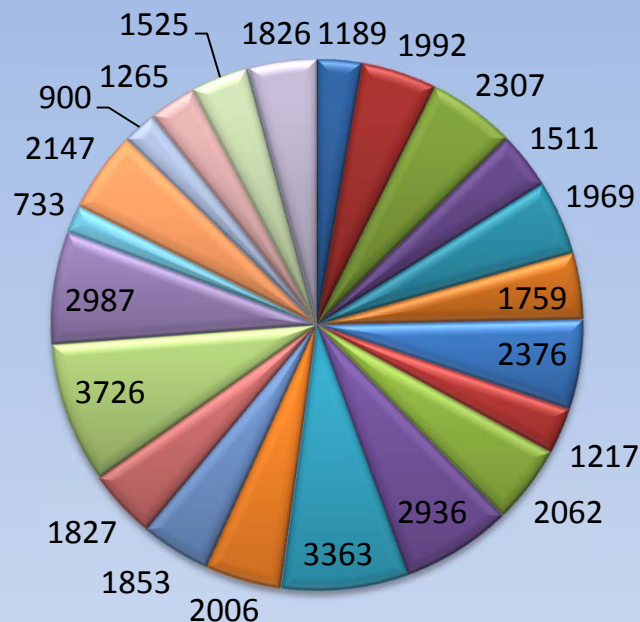

Number of people with dementia per region

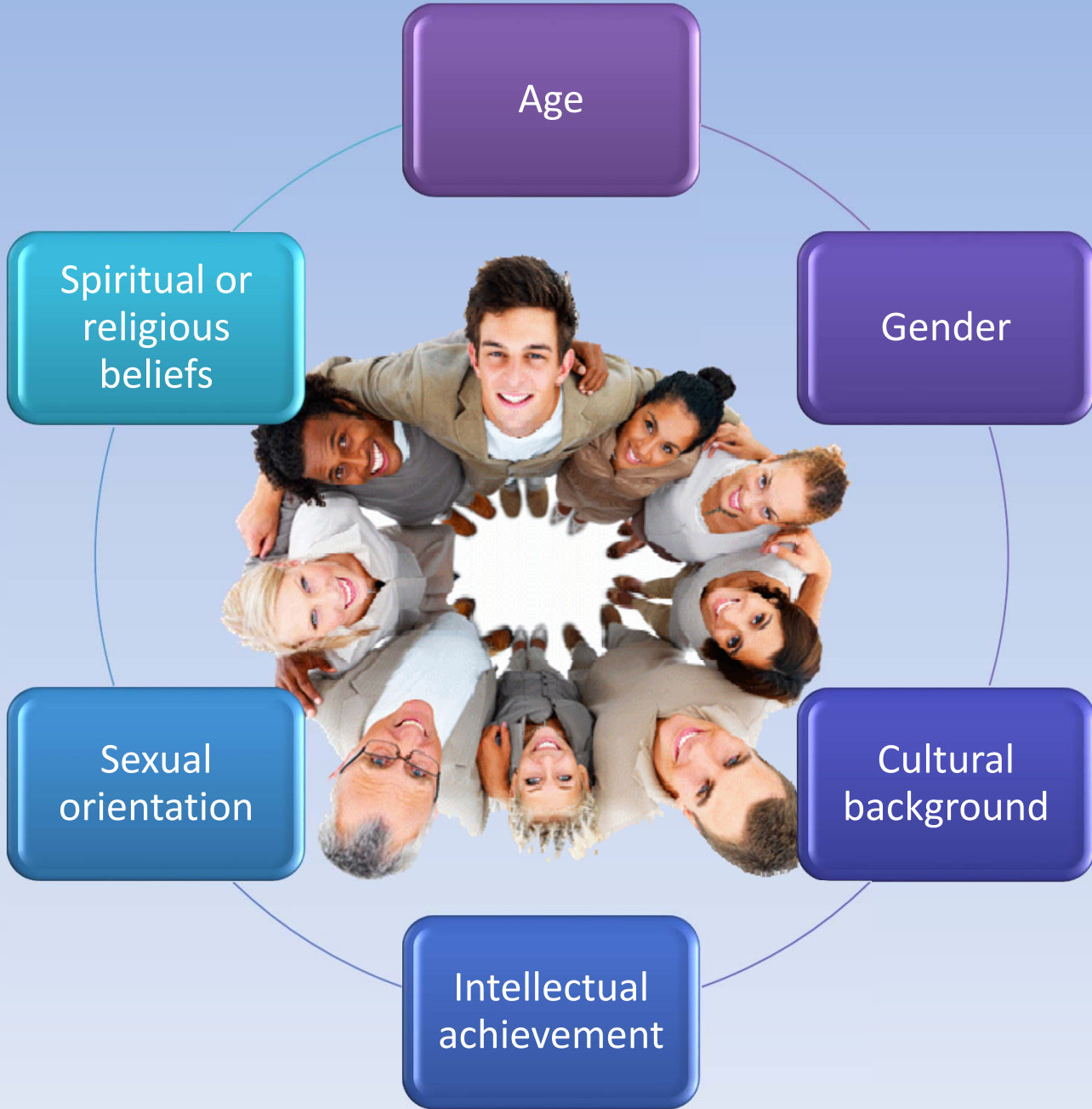

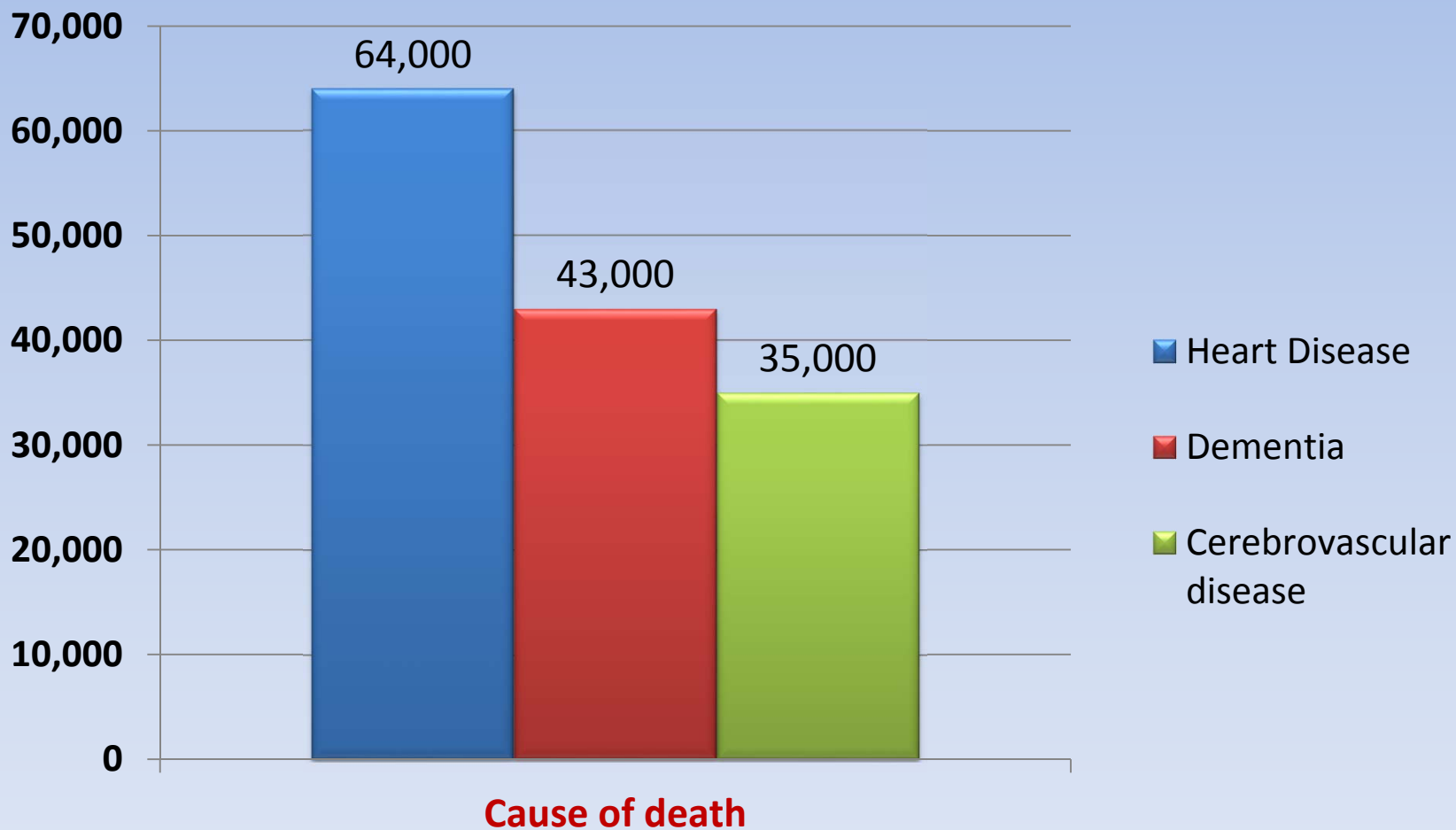

- Diagnosis rate for Wales is 42.8%



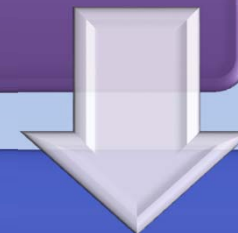
Leading Cause of Death 2012



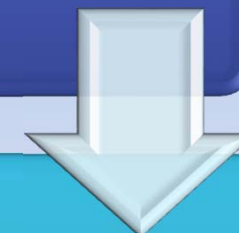

- **2nd leading cause of death in men over 80 after heart disease.**

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What is Dementia?



Dementia is a progressive and largely irreversible clinical syndrome that is characterised by a widespread impairment of mental function.
